Naples Botanical Garden Welcomes Bahamas National Trust**

**NAPLES, FL** – July 15, 2019 – For the past several years, Naples Botanical Garden has worked closely with staff at Bahamas National Trust, a nonprofit that manages the country’s national parks and strives to protect Bahamian biodiversity. During an exclusive Members-Only President’s Welcome Reception on July 18 in the Garden’s Kapnick Hall, members of the media are invited to learn more about this partnership’s aim to build shared capacity for conservation of rare flora species and staff exchange opportunities benefiting the professional development of both organizations. Recent efforts have focused on evaluating the extinction risk of more than 40 plant species of the Bahamas, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Florida, and Mexico for the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List.

Working in unison with local, state and federal organizations to conserve native flora at Naples Botanical Garden and in native habitat is a crucial piece of the Garden’s mission. This partnership is one of several throughout the US and Caribbean Basin.

The reception begins at 5:30pm, with remarks at 6pm. Cameras are welcome at this event.
