Award-winning photographer Paul Osborn utilizes macro photography to reveal distinct characteristics and details often unseen by the naked eye, from every vein on a waterlily petal to the individual hairs on some of our most common winged visitors.

Paul Osborn began his photography journey in 1994. A self-taught photographer, Osborn is skilled in the art of macro photography, creating powerful compositions that capture the stunning beauty of our natural world. He was introduced to Naples Botanical Garden in 2013 and has since shared thousands of his images which have been used in Garden publications, appeals, presentations, maps, website and other materials. Osborn is an active member of the Naples Digital Photography Club and resides in Naples, Florida, where he has lived since 1980.

The timing for an exhibition of this nature is fitting: As the Garden celebrates its 10th anniversary this season, the photos in this exhibit highlight the spectacular flora found throughout our cultivated gardens. *Inner Beauty* will be on display in Kapnick Hall through January 5. It is included with regular Garden admission and free for Members.
