Increasing access to fresh produce for Collier families

Naples Botanical Garden partners with Brighter Bites on food distribution this summer

NAPLES, FL – July 15, 2020 – Starting at 9:30am on Thursday, July 16, members of the nonprofit Brighter Bites will distribute boxes of fresh produce at no cost from the parking lot of Naples Botanical Garden. The partnership will continue weekly at the same time on July 23, 30, and August 6. There are no requirements for obtaining produce from this program; approximately 850 boxes are distributed each week on a first-come, first-served basis.

For families in need of access to fresh produce, Brighter Bites offers a valuable resource. By partnering with produce suppliers who donate fresh fruits and vegetables to Brighter Bites food banks in Southwest Florida, as well as in several states throughout the US, parents can offer fresh, healthy options to their children.

The Garden's collaboration with [Brighter Bites](#) expands upon existing partnerships with schools and community gardens through [Collier Greens](#), as well a partnership this spring in particular, when the Garden distributed 500 seedlings to families through the Lee School District Environmental Education Department's [Project Victory Gardens](#) program.
