In keeping with safety measures, stroll lighted pathways, enjoy special holiday items at Fogg Café, and hum along to festive music. Sculptures from *Steve Tobin: Nature Underground* promise to add an element of surprise and delight.

This year, Night Lights in the Garden runs November 27 – January 3, with extended hours on select evenings. Guests this year will enjoy more open spaces in the Garden, as capacity has been limited to maintain social distancing. There will not be Night Lights events on December 24, 25, or 31.
