## ***America's Everglades: Through the Lens of Clyde Butcher***

**NAPLES, FL – June 4, 2021** – There are just a couple weeks left to experience the world-renowned work of Clyde Butcher. On view in Kapnick Hall at Naples Botanical Garden through June 15, guests have the opportunity to explore large-format black-and-white photographs that capture untouched parts of the nation's largest subtropical wilderness.

With his century-old camera, Butcher has been exploring and documenting the Everglades for more than three decades. The result is a stunning collection of delicate ecosystems, rare botanical specimens, and sweeping landscapes that bring the wonder of this mysterious part of our country to light.

*America's Everglades: Through the Lens of Clyde Butcher* highlights Butcher's artistic eye as well as his deep and long-held commitment to conservation. His work challenges us to explore the heritage we share in the natural world and to work

together to protect it. Through his photography, Butcher hopes to educate the public by bringing environmental issues to the forefront of public consciousness.
